Regular care for children		
<p>Includes, but is not limited to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • CYPC • Members of TFSSR, whether f/Friends or not, for any activities involving children away from their parents 	<p>All committee members who have direct contact with children</p> <p>Three references are required</p> <p>Exceptions: from screening requirements:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • teen volunteers under 18, who must have a letter of support from the meeting • occasional volunteers 	<p>There must be two “approved adults” with children at all times, including when transporting them</p> <p>New committee members are not to be in contact with children until they become “approved adults”</p> <p>Exceptions must be with an “approved adult” committee member</p>
Intermittent events with children unaccompanied by parents		
<p>Includes, but is not limited to events such as:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • YSHYM held in Toronto • special programs such as the Christmas play • Young Friends’ overnights in Friends’ House under the care of the Meeting 	<p>At least two volunteers over 18 supervising the event must be “approved adults”</p> <p>It is important to ensure there is an appropriate ratio of adults to children</p>	<p>There must be two “approved adults” with children at all times, including when transporting them</p>
Consultants and other service providers working with or having access to children		
	<p>Must be accredited professionals if they are hired in their professional capacity.</p> <p>Others will be functioning as volunteers and will need to use TMM protocols</p>	<p>Accredited professionals may be alone with children if they abide by their professional accreditation regulations</p> <p>Others must be with an "approved adult"</p>
